> 5% HIV prevalence:Georgia and Ukraine





## 2018: Full-Blown HIV Epidemic among MSM




> 5% HIV prevalence:
13 of 22 countries of South
Eastern and Eastern Europe
and Central Asia
(10 in 14 countries EECA)

- > 10% Georgia (25% in Tbilisi), Montenegro, Romania
- 8 10% Moldova, Russia (22.8% in St. Petersburg), Ukraine (16% in Kyiv)
- 5 7% Belarus, Estonia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lithuania, Serbia
- 1 4% Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria (12.7% in Sofia), Kosovo, Macedonia, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan
- < 1% Albania, Armenia


# Legal Environment: Go West

#### Protection for LGBTI

Anti-Discrimination Legislation:

- EU Member States (Baltics)
- South-Eastern Europe
- Moldova
- Ukraine
- Georgia

(No constitutional protection based on SOGI)

# Legal Environment: Stay East

- Same-sex relations criminalized in Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan
- "Gay propaganda" ban in Russia since
   2013
  - Attempts to introduce in many other countries
- Shrinking space for civil society



# Legal Environment: all around

## Gay/bisexual/other MSM blood donation

• Prohibition in several countries

## Criminalization of HIV transmission/exposure

- 14 countries with sentencing that ranges from community service to 15 years prison

# **Rights Violations**

#### SOGI-based Violence

- Domestic violence
- Public attacks on LGBT individuals and LGBT community events
- State violence
- Gay men's hunt in Chechnya in 2017

#### Freedom of assembly

- Refusal of registration of LGBT non-governmental organizations: Russia, Belarus, Azerbaijan
- Prohibition of LGBT Prides

#### **Freedom of speech**

• Closing of LGBT websites in Russia

#### Hate speech

• From public persons, media, clergy, governmental workers





# Stigma and Discrimination in Healthcare Settings


### **Obstructed Access to Healthcare for Gay Men**

- Refusal of services based on SOGI
- Breach of confidentiality of health status or behavior
  - Major implications for other fields: losing a job, losing family, hate attacks
  - Blackmailing by healthcare workers- reported cases in Armenia, Belarus
- Turning from state institutions to private sector and NGOs

## ECOM: Study of Internalized Homonegativity and HIV Epidemic among MSM in EECA


- Negative attitude to own homosexuality that gay men acquire in a homophobic society.
- Online survey, August October, 2017
- 8,239 respondents in 12 countries

- Eurasian Coalition on Male Health
- 64% gay men and 27% bisexual men
- 30 years old median age
- Most respondents accept own homosexuality. Average acceptance in a country: 4.4. to 5.6 on a 1-7 scale
  - Internalized homonegativity might be higher in general gay male population








## Associations Between Use of HIV Services and Internalized Homonegativity












## Internalized Homonegativity and HIV Epidemic among MSM in EECA

Greater acceptance of one's own homosexuality is associated with more regular use of HIV testing and prevention services







# **Counteracting Human Rights Violations**



- Raising awareness of healthcare and social workers on SOGI issues
  - ToT module and regional trainings of trainers
  - Supporting local trainings of healthcare workers
- **Monitoring and documentation** of cases of SOGI-based discrimination in healthcare settings
  - 35 cases in 2017
  - Reports to UN Treaty Bodies (Belarus Committee against Torture and HRC, Macedonia - CEDAW).
  - Shadow reports to UPR, alternative reports to Ombudsman office
  - Examples used in trainings for healthcare workers
- Safety and protection in emergencies
  - Support to a local Emergency Response Group;
  - Personal protection of LGBT health activists.





# **Counteracting Human Rights Violations**



- LGBT community rights sensitization and literacy
  - Training module
  - Regional trainings of trainers
- Small grants for community mobilization and advocacy building

#### "Gender Zed" NGO

- Project on stigma and discrimination within HIV counselling and testing services.
- 'Secret clients' openly gay people visited
   92 institutions, received services only in 37
- Report with recommendations to the Provincial Health Department
- Training on SOGI issues delivered for 100 staff of all VCT institutions in the region
- Provincial standards of services reviewed







# Recommendations



#### To LGBT communities and LGBT community-based organizations chasevirus.org

- Decrease internal homonegativity;
- Invest in community mobilization, raise awareness and knowledge of own human rights;
- Identify and document cases of SOGI-based discrimination and violence;
- Demand protection from SOGI-based discrimination;
- Build coalitions with other communities.

#### For decision-makers

- Decriminalize same sex relations;
- Introduce and implement anti-discrimination legislation;
- Eliminate legal barriers for NGO, incl. LGBT NGOs;
- Address specific needs of LGBT and PLHIV in health services, ensure their availability and quality;
- Raise SOGI-related awareness of healthcare staff.
